

## Modern Slavery Act Report May 2026

Athabasca Basin Development Limited Partnership is a Saskatchewan Indigenous-owned investment company. Investments include partial or complete ownership in construction, underground mining, industrial security, electrical, diamond drilling, logistics, cannabis, retail, road maintenance, aviation and more.

The company is owned by the seven communities in the Athabasca region, including Black Lake First Nation, Fond du Lac First Nation, Hatchet Lake First Nation, Stony Rapids, Wollaston Lake, Camsell Portage and Uranium City. Of our ownership, the following investments are subject to significant influence and distribute goods in Canada:

- A7 Investments – 95%
- Arctic Beverages – 48.33% ownership
- Optek Solutions – 37.5% ownership
- Points North Freight Forwarding – 48.37% ownership
- Synergy Five Investments – 37.5% ownership
- DSG Power Systems – 100% ownership

The following investments are interest in jointly controlled enterprises and manufacture and distribute goods in Canada:

- Tru North RV, Auto & Marine Sales – 50% ownership.

### Anti-Slavery Policy Statement

Athabasca Basin Development values being a good corporate citizen. We, together with all of our investments, are committed to social and environmental responsibility. We are committed to employment equity, diversity and inclusion and foster a respectful workplace environment, including ensuring the health and safety of their workers, subcontractors and the public. This includes zero tolerance of any form of modern slavery and human trafficking in our company and our investments.

This report sets out the steps that Athabasca Basin Development has taken during 2025 to ensure that slavery, human trafficking and child labour are not taking place in any of its supply chains or in any part of its own operations.



## Risk Assessment and Due Diligence Process

As an investment company, our own business operations and supply chains primarily include professional services, and we have assessed the risk of modern slavery within our business and supply chain to be low.

We have been in discussions with all the companies we own and most of our companies are service companies that also use local professional suppliers, where we would assess the risk of modern slavery and child labour to be low. Of our companies that manufacture or distribute, the companies that import goods directly ensure that they procure material from professional, well-known suppliers where policies against modern slavery are in place. The companies that do import products directly from higher risk areas have supplier agreements in place with suppliers whereby the suppliers agree to comply with a code of conduct that includes compliance with law and protection of Human Rights.

Overall, we have not identified any forced labour or child labour in our operations, nor the operations of our investments and their supply chains. We have embedded responsible business conduct into our policies, management, and governance systems to ensure that we uphold our value of being a good corporate citizen.

## Future Commitment

Athabasca Basin Development is committed to the eradication of forced labour. We will continue to work with investment management teams to ensure that they are reviewing their international supply chains to identify risks related to modern slavery. We will continue to refine our processes as well as our governance processes to further implement, monitor and assess the effectiveness of anti-slavery policies and procedures in preventing and reducing the risks of forced labour.
